Title: Agreement of Purchase and Sale with Werner Bromberg Limited

Objective: To approve the agreement of Purchase and Sale of the former Fairground lands to Werner Bromberg Limited.

Background: Council authorized City Staff and the City Solicitor to finalize a sale agreement with Werner Bromberg Limited for the former Fairground lands. There were a number of issues that needed to be resolved in order to finalize the sale agreement. These issues included negotiation for additional lands to allow for the construction of a stormwater management pond and road connection to the Rotary Complex which will then be conveyed back to the City for nominal consideration.

The selling price per hectare was agreed to by Council as part of the RFP process in November, 2017. Further the additional lands for the stormwater management pond and roads was discussed in May 2018 and approved by Council and direction given to staff to finalize the Agreement of Purchase and Sale.

Analysis: A reference plan has been finalized. Parts 2, 3, 4 and 14 are to be sold to Bromberg. Part 14 is the additional land that is being purchased for the purposes of constructing services (stormwater management pond and road connectors to the Rotary Complex). The lands will be temporarily transferred to Bromberg to allow for the construction of the stormwater facilities and the road connection to the Rotary Complex are Parts 15, 16 and 17 on the reference plan and shall be returned to the City once the works are complete.

With respect to the additional lands to be purchased, being Part 14, a resolution has been prepared to exempt certain sections of Policy P.3.1 Sale and Other Disposition of Land as the appropriate public consultation and public notice has already taken place through the RFP process.

Financial Impact: The total sale price of the land is \$1,543,158.65. This is based on an area of 6.058 hectares at a price of \$254,730.71/hectare and includes the additional Part 14 lands. There have been costs over the years with respect to the Fairgrounds that have been unfunded to date. These costs include demolition of the previous buildings and environmental studies. The City has incurred legal and survey fees in regard to completing the sale. Previous costs have amounted to \$295,680.21. More recent costs are estimated to be \$10,000 to \$15,000.



Title: Dispatch Communications Recording System For Stratford Fire Department

Objective: To seek Council approval for unbudgeted capital expenditure to replace the aging and no longer supported dispatch communications recording system.

Background: The Stratford Fire Department Dispatch Center handles 3000 emergency calls per year on behalf of 21 fire departments within Perth and Huron Counties. Part of the call handling process is the mandatory recording of those calls in accordance with the National Fire protection Association Standard, NFPA 1221: Standard for the Installation, Maintenance, and Use of Emergency Communications Systems, 2016 edition. NFPA 1221 states:

7.6 Recording.

- **7.6.1** Communications centers shall have a logging voice recorder with one channel for each of the following:
- (1) Each transmitted or received radio channel or talkgroup
- (2) Each dispatch alarm circuit
- (3)* Each telecommunicator telephone
- **7.6.2** An instant recall recorder shall be provided for each telecommunicator position in the communications center.
- **7.6.3** Alarms that are transmitted over the required dispatch circuit(s) shall be automatically recorded, including the dates and times of transmission.
- **8.3.3** All incoming calls on designated emergency lines shall be recorded in accordance with this standard.
- **9.1.1.8** Alarms that are transmitted over the required dispatch circuit(s) shall have the dates and times of transmission automatically recorded at the communications center.

The current recording system was purchased and installed in 2002. Staff recently reached out to the original company that the system was purchased from and found the company no longer in business thereby leaving the current system unsupported.

Procedures are currently in place to handle short term disruptions while City IT professionals respond to any issues. The recording systems are 3rd party software systems and are not managed by internal IT staff. A new fully supported system should be purchased.

Analysis: Staff have sought out preliminary costing estimates for replacement of the current system and found prices ranging from \$30,000.00 - \$100,000.00. In accordance with the City's Purchasing Policy all purchases above \$25,000.00 must be conducted through an RFP process.

Due to the Fire Department having dispatching agreements that oblige the provision of recording services by the City as provider, Staff are requesting Council approval to replace the Dispatch Communications Recording System in 2018.

Financial Impact: The Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund R-R11-FIRE has an available balance of \$584,124.27.

Staff Recommendation: THAT Council approve the Stratford Fire Department to purchase a Fire Dispatch Recording System in accordance with the City's Purchasing Policy.

AND THAT funding for the system be drawn from the Fire Department's Capital Reserve Fund R-R11-FIRE.
